in the U.S.A.; 21 in Canada plus one Honorary Member, the Axone; 5 in Mexico; and two in Puerto Rico. Twenty-eight "boutons de passage" and one Honorary Member, the Y-chromosome", formed the overseas membership. They were scattered as follows: Argentina - 1, Dominica - 1, England - 3, Hungary - 2, Israel - 1, Italy - 1, Kuwait - 1, Lebanon - 1, Malta - 1, Netherlands - 2, New Zealand - 1, Phillipines - 1, Poland - 1, Scotland - 1, Spain - 5 + the Y-chromosome, Switzerland - 2, Venezuela - 1, West Germany - 2.

1981: The 35th Annual Meeting of the Cajal Club was held on Sunday, April 19, 1981 at the New Orleans Hilton Hotel. The morning Scientific Session began at 9:00 and consisted of two free papers followed by a Symposium organized by Dr. Peter Strick. The afternoon Scientific Session began at 1:00 and consisted of two free papers and a Symposium organized by Dr. George Martin. The Thirteenth Annual Pinckney J. Harman Memorial Lecture entitled "Anatomical and Functional Studies of the Descending Pathways in the Brain" was presented by Dr. H.G.J.M. Kuypers. In the introduction of Dr. Kuypers, the following bit of doggeral was read:

"A man of renown is H.G.J.M. Kuypers.
His initials abound like little sandpipers.
He has monkeyed around,
from the cortex on down,
'till his monkeys need windshield wipers."

The Business Meeting was held between the afternoon Symposium and the Harman lecture. Dr. Charles R. Noback was elected Nissl Body, and Dr. Edward G. Jones was elected Chairman of the Program Committee for 1983. This was the year that Dr. Howard A. Matzke had decided to step down as Apical Dendrite. He had served the Club in this capacity for twelve years, having succeeded Pinckney Harman in 1967. In recognition of his service, Howard was elected to the Honorary Position of "Neurofibrillary Tangle". Dr. David G. Whitlock was elected to become the third Apical Dendrite of the Club. The Club voted to increase the annual dues to \$10.00.

1982: The 36th Annual Meeting of the Cajal Club was held on Sunday, April 4, 1982 at the Hyatt Regency Hotel in Indianapolis, Indiana. The Scientific Session began at 8:30 with a series of five free papers. After a Coffee Break, it continued with four more free papers. The afternoon program began at 1:30 with two free papers and then a Symposium organized by Dr. Lois Laemle. The Fourteenth Annual Pinckney J. Harman Memorial Lecture, entitled "A Fish-Eye View of Nerve Regeneration." was given by Dr. Bernice Grafstein.

The Business Session was held between the afternoon Symposium and the Harman Lecture. Dr. Ann M. Graybiel was elected Nissl Body, and Dr. John K. Harting was elected Program Committee Chairman for 1984.

1983: The 37th Annual Meeting of the Cajal Club was held on Sunday, April 3, 1983 at the Atlanta Hilton Hotel in Atlanta, Georgia. The morning Scientific Session began at 9:10 with four free papers, and following a coffee break there was a Symposium on the pretectum organized by Dr. J. T. Weber. The afternoon program began at 2:00 with one free paper, followed by a Symposium on Transmitters and Receptors in the Cerebral Cortex, organized by Dr. E.G. Jones. The Fifteenth Annual Pinckney J. Harman

Memorial Lecture, entitled Functional Differences in the Myelinating Cells of the Central and Peripheral Nervous Systems, was given by Dr. Richard P. Bunge.

The Business Meeting was held between the afternoon Symposium and the Harman Lecture. Dr. Jacques Courville was elected Nissl Body, and Dr. Duane E. Haines was elected Chairman of the Program Committee for 1985.

1984: The 38th Annual Meeting of the Cajal Club was held at the Westin Hotel, Seattle on Sunday, April 8, 1984. The morning Scientific Session was devoted to a Symposium on selected topics related to the research of the late Stephen B. Edwards. It was organized by Dr. John K. Harting. The afternoon Scientific Session was devoted to a Symposium on the cell biology of sensory receptors organized by Drs Margaret Byers and Helen Sherk. The Sixteenth Annual Pinckney J. Harman Memorial Lecture, entitled Peptidergic systems in the retina central visual structures."

The Business Meeting, held between the afternoon Symposium and the 16th Harman Lecture, elected Dr. George F. Martin as Nissl Body and Dr. Leonard M. Eisenman as the Program Committee Chairman for 1986. Dr. David Whitlock was re-elected for a second term as Apical Dendrite.
